D. ACHIEVEMENTS AND SUCCESSES**1. Summarize your most innovative achievement or your greatest success story from the previous year.**

DOLETA's investment in Ohio is making a difference! Ohio TechNet (OTN) partnered with Ohio Board of Regents, the Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation and LIFT (Lightweight Innovations for Tomorrow) to create the Ohio Manufacturing Careers Council (OMCC). Employer engagement drives this initiative. OTN capitalized on outstanding employer relationships among partner institutions in helping to convene the initial meeting of OMCC. Ohio TechNet's 11 partner schools impact 70 of Ohio's 88 counties, enabling manufacturers to connect with community colleges regionally to resolve skills gap issues. OMCC work teams will focus on Manufacturing Image, Skills, and Product Commercialization.

In Y1, 6 TAA eligible individuals enrolled in TAACCCT funded programs; 4 obtained credentials over the course of the grant. These completers were enrolled in a variety of programs, including LCCC's Right Skills Now program and ZSC's Industrial Systems Engineering Technology degree. Among the successes, a veteran at ZSC became TAA eligible and obtained his degree with a 3.9 GPA, garnered 3 job offers, and accepted a position in Cambridge, OH. There was an increase in TAA certified individuals within Ohio regions in Y1. Plans were made to continue to work with the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services and local WIBs to deploy targeted outreach to these individuals.

Report Certification / Additional Comments

Grantee Remarks:	Ohio TechNet (OTN) utilized TAACCCT investment to advance Competency Based Education (CBE) statewide by leveraging the expertise of OTN partner Sinclair (SCC) in Y1. OTN also focused on Prior Learning Assessments. Plans were developed to research best practices nationally to be incorporated into policies within Ohio that encourage adults to return to college, obtain industry recognized credentials and launch new careers. OTN established Affinity Groups and Work Teams which shared best practices, developed curriculum, generated ideas and created solutions for increasing interest in Advanced Manufacturing careers statewide. Note: 55 non-incumbents completed in Y1, impacting employment outcomes; matches could not be made in HEI or UI wage employment data in instances where SSNs were not provided and where participants worked outside of Ohio; supplemental sources of data were used where applicable.
